## *Program has awarded \$93K since 2016*

Friends of the Bantam Jeep Association (FBJA) announced Tuesday that local nonprofit organizations can now apply to become the recipients of funds raised at the 2021 Bantam Jeep Heritage Festival.

The program has awarded more than \$93,500 to 501(c)3 nonprofit groups since 2016, according to a news release from Friends of the Bantam Jeep.

Applicants must provide up to a 500-word explanation on ways they benefit the community and how funds will be used and show proof of their 501(c)3 status.
